Safeguarding public health and animal welfare - a short film follows a mum on her journey to find out about the role of local authority inspectors.

Family cook and mum, Corinne Caddy, takes us on a journey to find out how meat ends up on our plates safely. She learns how local authority inspectors across the country guard against diseases such as avian influenza and BSE, play a leading role in animal welfare, help and advise the farming community and bring criminals to justice.

Media interest in animal welfare, highlighted by celebrity chefs such as Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall, Jamie Oliver and Gordon Ramsey, has demonstrated the importance of animal health and welfare in the food chain. Recent television programmes have heightened public awareness of animal health and welfare issues and the implications on the safety and quality of the food that they eat.
